The Research Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture

River Ranching

Conservation Research Group (CRG), an independent organization working in St. Alberts College (Autonomous), Ernakulam has successfully ranched captively breed indigenous ornamental fishes into Chitrapuzha river, Kakkanad, Ernakulam. To streamline the research and outreach activities, the CRG was formed in October 2007 in St. Alberts College (Autonomous), Ernakulam. CRG has made enviable strides in research and outreach in biodiversity conservation and management and has become one of the leading organisations in this field. The captive breeding technology of fishes was developed by the final year students of B.Voc Commercial Aquaculture and the experiment was completed in the Research Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture. Young ones of Nilgiri melon barb, Haludaria fasciata, Dotted sawfin barb, Pethia punctata, Ticto barb, Puntius ticto and Blackspot barb, Dawkinsia filamentosa have been ranched into the river. The ranching was done by Dr Vibin M, Head of the Research Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture. Assistant Professors and Members of CRG, Dr. Renjith Kumar, Dr. Jithu Paul Jacob, final year students Muzhamil, Nikhil S Pillai, Sindya Roy, Rizwana Basheer and Krishna also attended the ranching programme.





Vembanad Fish Count 2023

Vembanad Fish Count (VFC) is a quality initiative programme organised by ATREE and Conservation Research group (CRG) of St. Albert's College (Autonomous) since 2008. The sixteenth edition of VFC' 23 was conducted at Karmasadan Pastoral Centre, Alappuzha, on 29 and 30 May, 2023. Ten students from the Research Department of Fisheries (RDFA) and three faculty members (Dr. Santu K S. Dr. Radhika R, and Dr. Jithu Paul, Asst. Professors RDFA) participated in the VFC'23 at Alappuzha. A total of 50 species were recorded in the 16th edition of Vembanad Fish Count. A survey was conducted in the southern parts of the lake under the aegis of the Community Environment Resource Centre (CERC) a field academic unit of the Ashoka trust for Research in Ecology and Environment.

The first day of the programme started at 5.30 p.m. with the registration of volunteers. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Priyadarsanan Dharma Rajan, Senior Fellow, ATREE, and by Dr. K.V. Jayachandran, Former Dean, KUFOS. The orientation class was taken by Ms. Maneeja Murali, Senior Programme Officer, ATREE, CERC. The team was grouped into three and named the Western, Eastern, and Riverine groups for the survey. Five students represented the Western Team, in which Mr. Alex K. Baiju was selected as the team captain, and the remaining five students represented Team Riverine. Akshay Sebastian, a second-year B. Voc student, RDFA, was selected as the team captain.

On the second day, the VFC' 23 survey was flagged off by K. V. Dayal, an Environmentalist, at 6 a.m. Team Riverine was led by Dr. Priyadarshan Dharma Rajan and Dr. Benno Pereira P G, Asst. Prof. (Dept. of Zoology, University of Kerala). Five stations were selected for the fish count survey, namely, Punnamada (station 1), Chungam (station 2), Kainakiry (station 3), Kizhakke Vattakayal (station 4), and Kuppapuram (station 5), and a total of 17 species of finned fish and 3 shellfish were identified during the survey from the riverine area of Vembanad Lake. A total of eight species were recorded from station 1 in Punnamada, and at least one was found on station 5 in Kupapuram. The most dominant group was D. filamentosa (52), followed by Ambasis ambasis (48), Pseudoetroplus macculatus (46), and Carinotetradon travancoris (40). Carinotetradon travancoris was reported by all the stations. Aquatic weeds such as Pistia, Eichhornia, Cabomba, Salvinia, and Water Lily were found in the area. Fish parasites, nematodes, and isopods were reported during the survey, which indicates the deteriorating effect of the Vembanad lake ecosystem. Most fish caught were reported by gillnetting. The Vembanad Fish Survey for the year ended at 1.30 p.m., and the survey reports made by each team were presented at the valedictory function by team captains. Alex K. Baiju, a first-year B. Sc Aquaculture student, presented a report on the Western side of Vemabnad Lake during the function. The meeting concluded after distribution of certificates and group photographs at 4 p.m.
