Junior Scientist Programme Inspires Young Scientific Minds

The second session of the Junior Scientist Programme organised by Navadarsan took place on July 8, 2023. Students from various schools participated in this educational initiative which is aimed to nurture young scientific minds.

On the day of the event, students arrived at the College and were assigned to their respective Science Departments. In particular, the Department of Botany welcomed a group of 13 students, consisting of nine boys and four girls. The staff coordinators for the programme were Dr. K Madhusudhanan, Head of the Botany Department, Dr. Anisha S, Sri Rohit P J. Albert P Varghese and Arsha K S were the student coordinators for the event.

The students engaged in a series of hands-on experiments and demonstrations related to botany. These experiments covered topics such as the different parts of a flower, gram staining, plasmolysis in plant cells, and anatomical sections of monocot root and stem. A demonstration of the separation of plant pigments by Column Chromatography was also included. The students participated actively and they remained curious throughout these activities.

The session concluded with a demonstration of the column chromatography experiment. Students diligently documented their observations and findings in their record books, which were

subsequently signed by the faculty members. Afterwards, the students had the opportunity to explore the Department Museum, Herbarium, and the Botanical garden. The students gained insights into the world of botany through these visits.

A verbal feedback session was conducted during which the students expressed their satisfaction with the sessions and reported that no difficulties occurred during the experiments. The day's activities concluded around 3:30 p.m.












The Research Department of Fisheries and Aquaculture


