STREET PLAY ON HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Human trafficking is the trade of humans for the purpose of forced labour, sexual slavery, or commercial sexual exploitation for the trafficker or others. This may encompass providing a spouse in the context of forced marriage, or the extraction of organs or tissues, including for surrogacy and ova removal. The Department of Social Work in association with the Cultural Academy of Peace conducted a street play. The street play was displayed in KSRTC bus stand, Ernakulam. The MSW students performed the play with poise in their actions and sound and it attracted many and had a good audience. The major themes are with sexual trafficking, illicit labour markets and migration. The street play was rich with messages to the society regarding human trafficking, its causes, after effect and all. Group of 28 students from the social work department enacted the street play and 1 faculty member accompanied them.
