38th Kerala Science Congress: A Grand Celebration of Innovation and Ecosystem Restoration

The 38th Kerala Science Congress (KSC), a premier event in the state’s scientific calendar, was held from January 30 to February 2, 2026, at the prestigious St. Albert’s College (Autonomous), Kochi. Organized by the Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE), the event was themed “Ocean Science for Blue Economy and Ecosystem Restoration,” reflecting a critical commitment to sustainable development and environmental preservation. The four-day congress served as a vibrant platform for scientists, researchers, and students to exchange ideas under the overarching vision of “Celebrating Science, Transforming Lives”.

The congress was officially inaugurated by the Honourable Chief Minister of Kerala, Shri Pinarayi Vijayan, who emphasized the state’s dedication to fostering a robust scientific temper and leveraging research for the welfare of the public. A National Science Expo was held at the Kalpana Chawla Science Centre, followed by a formal National Science Meet. The inaugural session featured distinguished speakers, including Prof. T. G. Sitharam (Former Chairman, AICTE) and Prof. K. P. Sudheer (Executive Vice President, KSCSTE), who emphasized the role of science in national impact and strengthening the Science, Technology, and Innovation (STI) framework. Key highlights of the first day included plenary talks on India’s bioeconomy, scientific infrastructure through the I-STEM vision, and climate security. A high-level panel discussion further explored the convergence of state-led science and commercialization for national progress.



The subsequent days were dedicated to intensive technical sessions across 13 diverse disciplines, ranging from Agriculture and Biotechnology to Mathematical Sciences and Physical Sciences. Each session was hosted in specially named “Science Zones” honoring legendary Indian scientists such as Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw, Asima Chatterjee, and Tessy Thomas. Beyond traditional research, the congress also focused on Scientific Social Responsibility, highlighting the importance of bridging the gap between laboratory research and societal needs. By fostering such a comprehensive dialogue, the 38th KSC not only showcased Kerala’s scientific prowess but also paved the way for future innovations in ecosystem restoration and the blue economy.

Mini Marathon Flags Off 38th Kerala Science Congress

In a vibrant display of energy and communal spirit, a Mini Marathon was organized in Ernakulam as a grand prelude to the upcoming 38th Kerala Science Congress. The run, which aimed to bridge the gap between scientific inquiry and public engagement, commenced from the historic gates of St. Albert’s College (Autonomous) and concluded at the Kaloor Sports Campus. The event was officially flagged off by Ernakulam District Collector Ms. Priyanka G, IAS, who emphasized that such initiatives are vital for cultivating scientific awareness and promoting a culture of healthy living among the citizenry.

The marathon transformed into a true people’s movement, drawing an enthusiastic crowd of students, teachers, and sports enthusiasts. 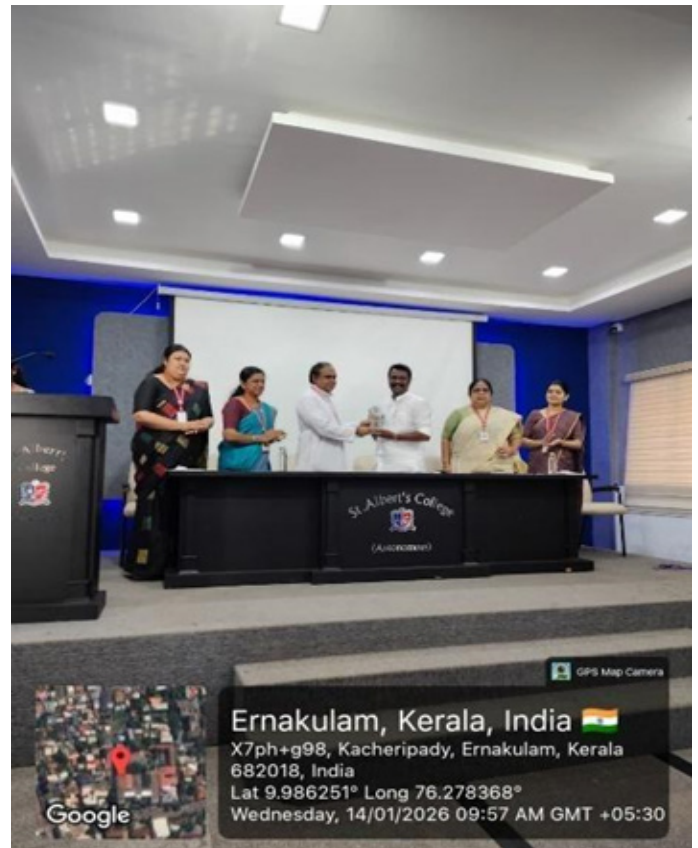
Department of Commerce

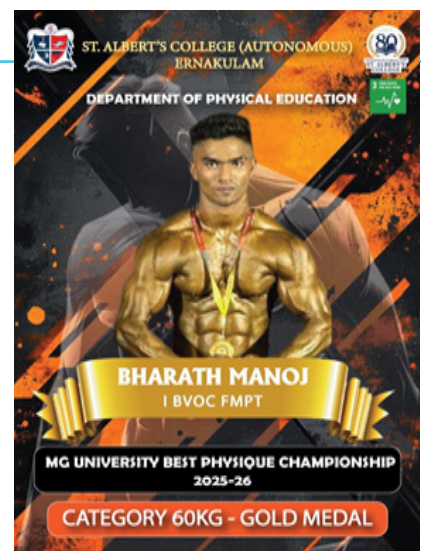
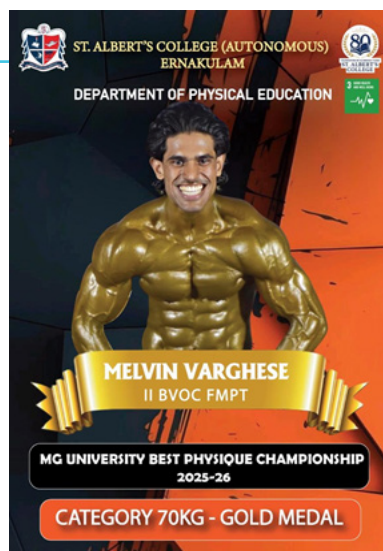
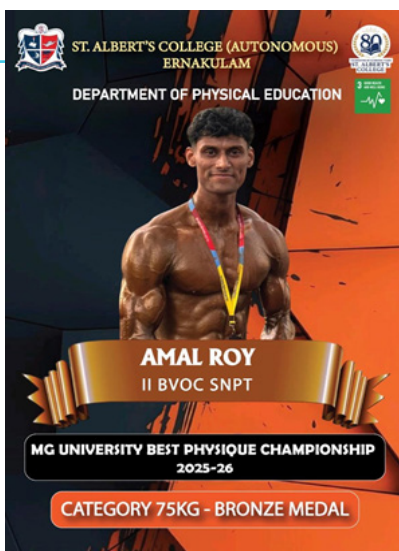
Student Achievements



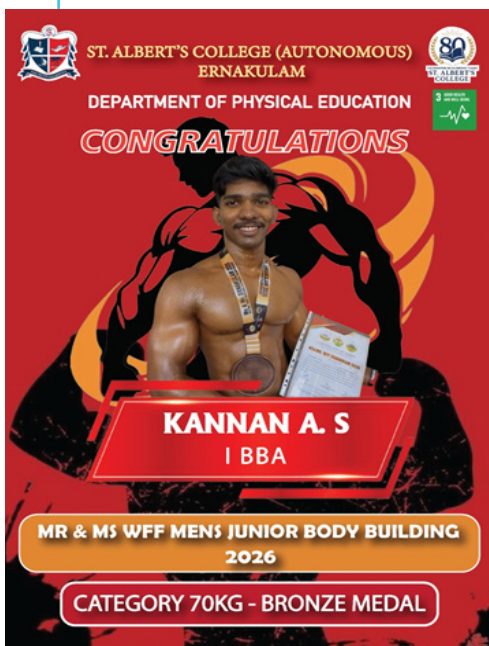
